DUAL ENROLLMENT</p> <p>The law mandates that school districts shall admit to the public schools resident school-age children who are accepted in current membership in a nonpublic school for instruction in one or more courses or subjects, other than elementary programs, under a "dual enrollment" or "shared time" arrangement between the public school district and the nonpublic school. The purpose of this policy is to delineate the requirements for such dual enrollment in those courses or subjects of the Seneca Valley School District which are subject to such mandate.</p> <p>For the purpose of this policy, <b>dual enrollment</b> is defined as the enrollment of resident, nonpublic school students to particular courses or subjects of the district. Courses subject to dual enrollment include secondary courses, vocational-technical courses, including those conducted at the Butler Area Vocational-Technical School, and kindergarten. The district's elementary program is not subject to dual enrollment.</p> <p><u>Procedures And Requirements</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Enrollment Arrangements. Arrangements for dual enrollment of nonpublic school students in district courses or subjects in accordance with this policy shall be made upon application by the nonpublic school of primary enrollment. Individual pupils or parents desiring such dual enrollment shall be referred to the district to contact the appropriate nonpublic school administrator to establish dual enrollment arrangements.</li> <li>2. Schedules. Attendance in district courses or subjects shall be in accordance with the district's regular schedule. Nonpublic school pupils enrolled on a dual basis in district courses or subjects are expected to be present and punctual for all district classes in which they are enrolled. The nonpublic school, the parents and the student shall be solely responsible for those arrangements; e.g., transportation, coordination with the nonpublic school schedule, etc. necessary to allow the pupil to attend the district course(s) or subject(s) in accordance with the district's regular schedule.</li> </ol>
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<p>4. Delegation of Responsibility</p>	<p>3. Regular Attendance. Nonpublic school pupils enrolled on a dual basis in district courses or subjects are expected to be present on a regular, daily basis. Those nonpublic school students enrolled on a dual basis in district courses or subjects who fail to regularly attend the course or subject may be excluded from further participation by written notice from the Superintendent.</p> <p>4. Transportation. The nonpublic school student shall be eligible to utilize transportation services regularly provided by the district to public school students at the beginning and end of the school day in accordance with the district's regular transportation schedule over established routes. The nonpublic school or nonpublic school parent(s) shall be responsible for transportation of nonpublic school students between the public school and the nonpublic school or for any transportation that does not coincide with the district's regular transportation services.</p> <p>5. Discipline. Nonpublic school students enrolled in district courses or subjects shall be subject to all rules and regulations of the district, including student discipline policies, to which all other district enrollees are subject. Teachers, principals and administrators shall have the same authority over the comportment of such nonpublic school students as they have over all other enrollees.</p> <p>6. Grading/Credits. Grades for nonpublic school students enrolled in district courses or subjects shall be issued by the district to the nonpublic school according to the regular, established grading system. Credit for the completion of courses or subjects, if any, shall be issued by the nonpublic school, as the school of primary enrollment, toward the nonpublic school's graduation requirements.</p> <p>The Board authorizes the Superintendent and/or designees to establish such other administrative guidelines, procedures or requirements as is necessary for the implementation of this policy.</p>
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
