POSTGRADUATE STUDENTS</p> <p>It shall be the policy of the Board to admit students under the age of twenty-one (21) to the secondary school of the district to audit courses on an individual basis, after a diploma has been earned. Such admission shall be without cost, provided that the applicant submits a request in writing setting forth the reasons for such study and provided that such request is approved by the principal after reviewing the previous conduct and academic performance of the applicant.</p> <p><u>Summer School, Tutoring and Evening Classes</u></p> <p>Credit toward graduation for tutoring or summer school work can be granted.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. All proposed work shall be approved and recommended by the high schools prior to the student's enrollment.</li> <li>2. Students may be required to attain a satisfactory rating on a standardized test to be administered by the school, before credit can be earned.</li> <li>3. Summer school credits shall be accepted from public schools operated under the regulations of the Pennsylvania Department of Education, for courses which have been taken during the regular school year and failed.</li> <li>4. Summer school credits in the above mentioned approved schools may require the administration of standardized tests when the courses studied have not been taken during the regular school years.</li> <li>5. School work taken in summer schools other than those operated and approved by the State of Pennsylvania shall receive credit only upon prior approval of the high school principal.</li> <li>6. Tutoring, during the school year, shall not be approved for regularly enrolled high school students, except in the subject areas in which they are currently enrolled and when necessary to keep the student abreast of his/her studies when absence is due to illness or other legal causes.</li> </ol>
