<p>1. Purpose</p> <p>2. Authority SC 511 (c)</p> <p>3. Guidelines SC 510, 517</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">231. SOCIAL EVENTS AND CLASS TRIPS</p> <p>The Board recognizes the value of student social events and class trips in enhancing and enriching the school experience for students.</p> <p>The Board shall make school facilities available and provide appropriate staff for social events within the school facilities which have been approved by the Superintendent and/or building principal.</p> <p>For social events which take place outside of school facilities, approval is required by the Board and or Superintendent.</p> <p>As voluntary participants in school social events and class trips, students shall be held responsible for compliance with district policies and rules. Infractions of those rules will be subject to the same disciplinary measures applied during the regular school program.</p> <p>Participation in school events is not a right and may be denied to any student who has demonstrated disregard for the policies and rules of the school.</p> <p><u>Parties</u></p> <p>Class activities shall be under strict control of the building principal. Class parties, club meetings, etc., shall close by 10:30 p.m. unless otherwise approved by the building principal.</p> <p>Elementary grades or classes may schedule activities including refreshments upon approval by the principal.</p> <p><u>Dances</u></p> <p>School dances to provide opportunities for social growth are encouraged. Such events are held for resident secondary pupils and their escorts or guests only. Dances shall be regulated by published rules approved by the building principal.</p>

<p>Pol. 204</p>	<p><u>Trips By Clubs And Organizations</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Clubs and organizations may take noneducational trips, except during school hours. 2. Regulations concerning transportation, permission slips, conduct, chaperones, and time limits shall be the same as those under the educational trip policy.
<p>Pol. 218</p>	<p><u>Senior Prom</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Seniors who demonstrate behavior contrary to school policy at the senior prom or after-prom automatically forfeit their privilege to participate in the graduation ceremony. 2. Underclassmen who demonstrate behavior contrary to school policy at the senior prom or after-prom, subject themselves to the appropriate penalties provided for in Board policy.
<p>Pol. 227</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. Any student or student's guest who violates the drug and alcohol policy or displays disorderly conduct at the senior prom or after-prom shall be immediately referred to the appropriate law enforcement agency. 4. Seniors whose behavior at the prom prevents them from participating in the graduation ceremony may make arrangements to obtain their diploma by meeting with their parents in the principal's office the week following graduation.
<p>4. Delegation of Responsibility</p> <p>SC 511 (c)</p>	<p>The Superintendent shall develop procedures for the conduct of student social events and class trips which shall include the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Designation of a staff member who shall be the Board employee responsible for the event. 2. Provision of adequate adult supervision or police protection, as required by the circumstances of the event. 3. Formulation of rules and regulations governing the conduct and safety of all participants and distribution of such rules and regulations to all students and adults involved.
