

Uniform Care and Responsibilities – Colorguard

Each Colorguard member is responsible for the following:

- Check uniform & other items for damage, regularly. Indicate any damage (such as stains, fabric damage and wear) on the *Uniform Receipt Acknowledgement* form, to be completed annually. If damage occurs during the season, promptly report it to the coaches and the uniform committee.
- Adjusting the pant leg by hemming. **Holes generated at the hemlines will be considered negligence and the student will be required to replace the uniform as a result.** No assessment will be made for normal wear and tear. This is for damages due to lack of proper care.

Proper Uniform Care:

- Properly hang the uniform on the hanger.
- Handwash uniform in cold water with Woolite following every performance.
- Do not dry-clean!!
- Do not wring or twist.
- Line dry, looping the legs over to prevent the uniform from stretching. It may also lay flat to air dry.
- Do NOT dry the uniform in a dryer. The heat from home & commercial dryers can damage the uniform and will result in the student being required to replace the uniform.
- Only food provided by the band boosters may be consumed while in uniform.
- Garment bag is to be used to store only the uniform.
- Wash garment bag in cold water and hang to dry. Do this at least once a year.
- Raincoats must be completely dried, both inside and out after use. They also must be refolded into the storage pocket.
- Uniform must be returned cleaned and in good condition.

Dress for Success (aka REQUIRED uniform attire):

- Go easy on the make-up.
- A unitard must be worn under the uniform.
- Shoes should be cleaned & polished.
- Scrunchies will be worn for every performance.
- Jewelry & nail polish are not to be worn.

Replacement cost for damages due to negligence is as follows:

Raincoat	\$50
